PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This month we have had two visits from SAPOL, the first was a session on SCAMING which was very interesting for all those who attended. It showed us how easy it was to be caught out by these bad, but cleaver people and how they worked the system to obtain these ill gotten gains.

The second session was about securing your house and what to do to assist the police when your house has been visited by criminals. This was a very interesting session with several topics covered which included getting rid of packaging from appliances to keeping shed doors closed and even leaving rubbish bins out when you go away. A question was asked about all of the equipment that they carry and the weight of it which is between 6.5 kg and 7.5 kg and when the camera on an Officer starts recording. I am now in the process of setting up another session with a member of SAPOL regarding traffic rules.

This month we have been working on applying for grants which will allow the Sub-Branch to be more compliant regarding the storage and handling of food, security of the bar area with a mesh roller door. A quote for a grant for the replacing the putty around the windows and painting them. We are also working on grants to fix the walls around the building as there is also work required on them. The canopy over the stove may also require some work on it as it may not be compliant with today's standard as required insurance companies and council building standards.

Elder Care are looking into repairing the wall down at the end of the building against the dining room. Water has been seeping into the dining room which is creating a few problems.

In October on the 25th, I have arranged a visit from the CFS regarding bushfire preparedness, as this happens to fall within the Veterans Health Week period we have applied for a grant to provide morning tea through DVA. This presentation, as is all of these presentations are open to the public so please bring your friends along.

Thinking even further along we are now starting to plan for Remembrance Day with a light lunch back at the Sub-Branch after the service. We need to remember that Remembrance Day this year falls on a Saturday and so will be sharing the space with the Farmer's Market.
